The CLOtC National Conference is an event dedicated to learning outside the classroom, bringing together teachers, school leaders, educational providers, researchers, policymakers, and sector partners for a day of inspiration, collaboration, and professional learning. This year's theme, **Engage, Connect, Enrich**, celebrates the transformative power of learning beyond the classroom. Through inspiring keynote speakers, interactive workshops, panel discussions, and opportunities to network, the conference will explore how high-quality LOtC can engage learners, connect them with their communities, the natural environment, and the wider world, and enrich the lives of all children and young people.

Deputy Headteacher, Oriel High School

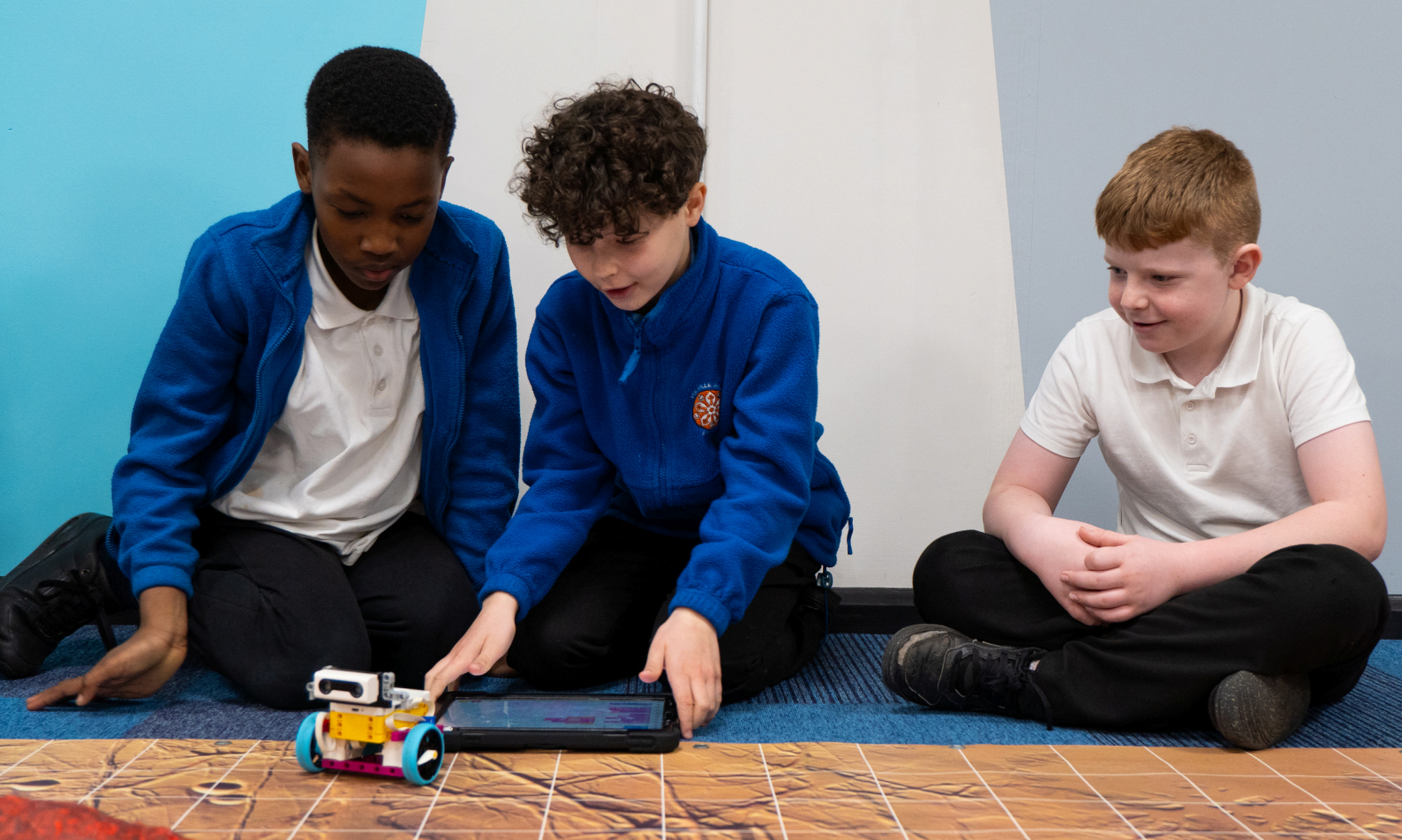
